March 2014

AGM – adopted constitution, elected a Committee

April 2014

- Community Tea at St Stephen's Rosslyn Hill
- Receive £6000 grant from Locality

May 2014

Apply for official designation

Summer 2014

- Festival stalls, gathering opinions and members

September 2014

- Consult on Vision for Hampstead
- Launch new website and membership platform

October 2014

Camden Council officially designates Forum



November 2014

- "Community Conversation" event, begin to develop policy priorities and options

January 2015

- Work plan devised with help of consultant
- Questionnaire on possible grant proposal ideas for South End Green;
 80 responses received
- February 2015
 - Policy research begins

March 2015

- Review of conservation area statements begins
- 800-plus members



Neighbourhood plan Next steps

1. Agree the area of your plan and who will produce it with your local authority

2. Ask people about the issues they would like to see addressed 3. Produce a draft plan for public consultation with evidence to back your policies

4. Submit your final plan to the local authority 5. Meet the "basic conditions" to gain a successful result from an independent examination

6. Win a referendum

a. Express these objectives as planning policies

b. Validate this with an evidence base that includes the results of the community engagement

c. Produce a draft plan for public consultation

Hampstead Neighbourhood Forum Work plan

Identify:	what sort of policies could support our Aims & Objectives
Review:	existing policies and data to see how we can "add value" with our own policies
Draft:	new policies
Engage:	with Camden and local community on these proposed policies
Re-draft:	review and engage some more!
Target:	to consult on first draft in autumn 2015.
